A NEW WAY TO TELL STORIES

For ages, libraries have been an almost inexhaustible archive of stories. The concept of storytelling comes natural to our region and our community. Annually, our small town hosts one of the fastest growing storytelling festivals in the south. So, as librarians, we are constantly challenged to tell stories.

This Christmas, our puppet team will be performing with a new medium called shadow puppetry. Shadow puppetry is an ancient form of storytelling and entertainment which uses flat articulated cut-out figures (shadow puppets) which are held between a source of light and a translucent screen or scrim. A puppeteer can make the figures appear to walk, dance, fight, nod and laugh. Shadow puppetry has a long history in many cultures but especially in Southeast Asia and we're going to attempt to bring it to the children and parents of Mountain Regional. Join us this Christmas season for our interpretation of Dr. Seuss' *The Grinch*.
